Introduction to Copyright, General principles of copyright in Indian context, Copyright law in India; Categories of copyrightable works, Originality and fixation requirements, Idea-expression dichotomy and Modicum of Creativity.

Authors and first ownership, Works for hire and employment, Joint ownership, Assignment and licensing of copyright, Rights of Copyright Owners, Fair use.

Module II: Copyright (Practice)

Application for Registration of Copyright and the prosecution; case studies.

Module III: Industrial Design (Theory)

Introduction to Industrial Design, Link between Design & Copyright, Design laws in India, Functional versus artistic aspects in design protection.

Module IV: Industrial Design (Practice)

Design Registration Process, Eligibility criteria for design protection, Step-by-step guide to registering industrial designs, Design classification, Preparing design application materials (drawings, images, descriptions), Filing procedures and deadlines, Office actions and responses; case studies.
