## Schema for Implementation of Inter-Disciplinary Courses

Course Credit: 2

Courses to be offered by Centres of the University

Note: The Interdisciplinary Courses of 2 Credit aim at providing exposure to disciplines of study other than those already provided by the University. The intent behind this is to expand the horizon of learning and enrich the same through incorporation of interdisciplinary insights. The Research Centres of the University may explore interdisciplinary areas...areas in which the disciple of Law intersects with varied disciplines of Science, Technology, and Humanities etc. Interdisciplinary Courses of 2 Credit may also be independently offered by Adjunct Faculty/ Visiting Faculty inducted by the University.

In lieu of courses offered by Research Centres, students may opt for courses offered by NPTEL, under the aegis of SWAYAM, of duration of 12 weeks. Such students would also have to inform about their choice of course to the Examination Section in the beginning of the Semester and also appear in the terminal examination conducted by NPTEL. Self-certified copy of e-certificate issued by NPTEL would have to be submitted to the Examination Section for record.

The modified course structure featuring Choice Based Credit System would be effective from Academic Year 2020-21 and would attain its optimal strength in five (5) years, that is, 2024-25. A plan for introduction of the Interdisciplinary Courses of 2 Credit over a period of five (5) is proposed hereunder.

Ethics with respect to law and research, Intellectual honesty and research integrity; Publication ethics: definition, introduction and importance, best practices/standards sittings initiatives and guidelines; COPE, WANE etc. Conflicts of interest, scientific misconducts; Falsification, Fabrication and Plagiarism (FFP), UGC Guidelines on Plagiarism and self-plagiarism, Redundant Publications, Publication misconduct.

### **Publication Ethics**

Publication ethics: definition, introduction and importance, Best practices/standards setting initiatives and guidelines: COPE, WAME, etc. Conflicts of interest, Publication misconduct: definition, concept, problems that lead to unethical behavior and vice versa, types, violation of publication ethics, authorship and contributor-ship, identification of publication misconduct, complaints and appeals, predatory publishers and journals, UGC Guidelines on Plagiarism and self-plagiarism.
