

an intellectual creation comes into existence, necessitating its recognition, protection, and commercialization. Prof. Banakar elaborated on the concept of sustainable prosperity and linked it to the global economic landscape. He stressed how development and prosperity are increasingly driven by innovation and the effective use of IP systems worldwide. In this context, he discussed India's position and the potential for achieving sustainable growth through robust IPR mechanisms. He also addressed the differentiation within the field of IP and the importance of protecting various categories of rights. Emphasis was placed on the significance of preserving IPRs and the growing relevance of patents, especially in sectors like pharmaceuticals and technology, where innovation plays a critical role.

Additionally, the speaker outlined diverse career opportunities in the field of IP law. Prof. Banakar discussed key domains such as – prosecution, preservation, protection etc. Each domain was explained with relevant examples to provide practical insights into the legal profession related to IP. The session offered a comprehensive understanding of how IP law contributes to national and global development, while also highlighting its career potential.

The session was attended by almost 60 students from the institution and it ended with interactions with the participants whereby questions raised by them were taken up by the resource person. Dr. Pankaj Kumar, DPIIT-IPR Chair Professor, NLUJAA delivered the vote of thanks.
