

Call for Course Proposals: Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC) at NLUJA, Assam

The National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam, invites **course proposals from interested academicians and professionals** for offering **Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDCs)** under its revised academic framework. Introduced in the Academic Year 2020–21 with the approval of the University's statutory authorities, the MDCs aim to encourage learners to engage with diverse disciplines and explore the intersections of law with emerging and critical fields of knowledge.

As per the newly adopted structure:

- Enrolment in MDCs will be optional for students of NLUJA, Assam
- Each course will carry 100 marks and will be assessed through a comprehensive evaluation process.

- **Distribution of Marks:**

Examination	Marks	Qualifying Marks
End Semester	50 Marks	
Mid Semester	25 Marks	
Project	15 Marks	7.5 Marks
Project Presentation	5 Marks	2.5 Marks
Attendance	5 Marks	75 % attendance

Note: Out of 100 marks a student needs to secure a minimum qualifying marks of 50.

- MDCs will be open to students of NLUJA, Assam and also to learners from other institutions through a structured enrollment process.

Invitation for Course Proposals

The University welcomes proposals from qualified **academicians, researchers, professionals, and domain experts** to offer MDCs in **emerging and interdisciplinary areas**, including but not limited to:

- Artificial Intelligence and Law
- Data Protection and Cybersecurity
- Law and Technology
- Climate Change and Environmental Governance
- Gender and Social Justice
- Public Health and Law
- Intellectual Property and Innovation
- Human Rights in the Digital Age
- Law and Sustainable Development
- Media, Ethics, and Democracy
- Law and the Global South

- Governance and Public Policy

In addition to above subjects, the faculty may offer any other subject under MDC.

Each MDC will be for **2 credits**, with sessions delivered over **16 hours**. These may be conducted either **across the semester** or offered as a **compact module**, depending on the nature of the course and mutual convenience. Selected course instructors will be paid an **honorarium of ₹1000 per contact hour**.

How to Apply

Interested individuals are requested to submit a **brief proposal** outlining:

- Course Title and Summary
- Proposed Learning Objectives and Outcomes
- Weekly Topics/Modules
- Assessment Plan
- Brief Profile of the Instructor

Proposal Review and Approval

All submitted proposals will be **examined by a duly constituted committee**, and courses will be launched **only upon the approval of the Academic Council and the Executive Council** of the University.
