Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) has sanctioned an IPR Chair to the university in order to facilitate research activities on IPR promotion and management.




The University campus is situated in a beautiful landscape facing mighty Brahmaputra River with an imposing hill in the background in a sprawling 150 *bighas* of land in Amingaon. Academic Block, Administrative Block, Boys Hostel and Girls Hostel with excellent modern facilities. The University has reached its next level in terms of the infrastructure facilities. Every faculty member is provided with an independent chamber to study and do research and guide students visiting them. The University is at the threshold of becoming a great legal education institution in the coming years.

Construction of Library Building, Judicial Academy, Staff Quarters, Guest House, VC's Bungalow, Registrar's Bungalow and other support structures are under process

#### Academic Block

Academic Block with the state-of-the-art facilities consisting of classrooms, faculty rooms, boys and girls common rooms, moot court hall and other facilities is constructed. The customized smart classrooms with digital board, LCD screen, LCD projector, microphone, spacious seating arrangements in a theatrical condition with central air conditioning, etc. have been made available in the new building.



#### Administrative Block

Administrative Block is built with modern facilities housing VC's Office, Offices of Registrar, Finance Officer, Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrars, Academic, Administrative, Examination, IT Section, Accounts, Development, Engineering Sections and all other support services.

There is a Meeting Hall with excellent IT arrangements adjacent VC's office for conducting meeting of Academic Council, Executive Council, General Council and other bodies. There is a Conference Hall accommodating 150 persons to conduct conferences and seminars. There is a Moot Court Hall with most modern ICT equipment for conducting national and international level moot court competitions. There are also conference rooms of smaller types in the building. There is a well-equipped Health Centre to provide first aid and basic medical facilities. To tackle any kind of medical emergency the University owns an ambulance that is available 24x7.

#### Hostel

There are two hostels one for boys and the other for girls, with single and double occupancy, with smokeless kitchen, spacious dining area, reading hall, gymnasium, yoga, and library room, etc. In order to facilitate the overall growth of its students, the University has developed a congenial and homely atmosphere in its residential campus. The students belonging to different cultural backgrounds amalgamate to bring forth a sense of unity even while retaining their diversity thereby presenting a true picture of the saying, "Unity in Diversity". # Library

#### CENTRE FOR CLINICAL LEGAL EDUCATION AND LEGAL AID CELL

#### March 20, 2018

#### CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL LAW

#### December 22 - 23, 2018

Two Day Regional Workshop on Biodiversity Related Laws was held in the University under the aegis of the Centre for Environmental Law, Advocacy and Research (CELAR).

#### March 09 - 10, 2019

The Centre for Environmental Law, Advocacy and Research (CELAR), organised a Two-Day International Conference on Climate Change on 9th and 10th March 2019. It was co-sponsored by the prestigious Shastri Programme Development Grant (SPDG) of the binational Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute, New Delhi. The focal area of the Conference was to explore the multidisciplinary contours of climate change.

As such, the conference witnessed the presentation of research made by seventy select people across various academic disciplines, like law, economics, technology, geography, sociology, business, commerce and technology. It also witnessed the scholarly presence of over fifty delegates. The participants hailed from Assam and other places across the length and breadth of India as well as from several foreign countries like Bhutan, Nepal, Bangladesh and Mexico.



The Conference dwelled on three primary themes namely, the international dimension on climate change, focussing specially on the Indo-Canadian dimension and the national and north east Indian dimension on climate change. To stimulate discussions and debates, eminent personalities and experts in each of the thematic dimensions were present. The luminaries included judges like Chief Justice A.S. Bopanna, Justice S. Shyam and Justice U. Bhuyan of Gauhati High Court, Justice P.M.M. Peires, former Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Sri Lanka and Dr. Ranjan Chatterjee from the National Green Tribunal. It also included lawyers like Mr. Sanjay Upadhay and Mr. Sudhir Mishra of the Supreme Court of India, academicians like Prof. (Dr.) Armin Rosencraz from Stanford University, Prof. (Dr.) Phillip Cullet from SOAS University of London, Prof. (Dr.) M.K. Ramesh from NSLIU, Prof. (Dr.) Chandan Mahanta from IIT-G and activists like Ms. Rama Rauta, Pioneer of the Save Ganga Movement, Mr. Jadav Payeng, the Forest Man of India and Mr. Rajendra Singh, the Waterman of India. Led by such personalities, the technical sessions of the Conference witness some intense deliberations on how best to combat climate change, especially the peculiar climate vulnerabilities of Assam and North East India. The deliberations will soon be consolidated in the form of principles and published as the 'Guwahati Declaration on Climate Change'. The Guwahati Declaration will be presented to the state and other non-governmental stakeholders in order to assist policy and action making aimed to combat change. The Conference will become an annual event and the Guwahati Declaration will be annually amended as and when necessary. The research proceedings of the Conference will be published in the form of a book and be made available to the public.

#### CENTRE FOR GENDER JUSTICE

#### September 06-07, 2018

The Centre for Gender Justice of the University in collaboration with Brotherhood, New Delhi organised a Two Day Workshop on September 6 and September 7 on the topic "Women and Disability" at the Seminar Hall, Administrative Block, NLUJA Assam. Differently abled women are saddled with multiple disadvantages. As women in traditional patriarchal societies women have to negotiate life through a string of challenges. With the burden of disability women are further beset with difficulties. Differently abled women are the most marginalized in Indian society. They are deprived of political, social, economic, and health opportunities. Through this workshop, the Centre aspired to bring to fore the issues faced by the differently abled women in terms of the social space they can lay their claim on, the opportunities of life they can explore, basically their trials and tribulations. Media narratives have been consciously chosen as an integral part of this exercise, for such narratives have the potential, to mirror up to nature the social realities as they exist in our times. Narratives have the potential to emote, to make the right pitch, to strike the right cord and resonate with the experiential reality of the audience. Therefore, these narratives provide good learning. With this intent, the centre has forged collaboration with the Delhi based NGO – Brotherhood who conduct International Film Festivals on issues related with disability as a part of their awareness raising campaign. #### February 16, 2019

Regional Consultation on Review of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 was organized by the Centre for Gender Justice, NLUJA, Assam in collaboration with the National Commission for Women. #### **ON-CAMPUS PLACEMENT RULES**

#### Introduction

On-Campus Placement activity at National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam is conducted under the aegis of the Placement Facilitation Committee (PFC) constituted by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. The Placement Facilitation Committee (PFC), a body comprising of faculty members, students and administrative staff, endeavours towards providing pre-placement training sessions to students and facilitating the process of on-campus recruitment.

## Placement Facilitation Committee (PFC)

The responsibility of the PFC includes:

- a. Conducting training programmes for students on regular basis in order to hone their soft skills.
- b. Updating the inventory of firms and companies who would be invited for on-campus placement on a regular basis.
- c. Maintaining close liaison with the firms and companies.
- d. Identifying agencies for conducting evaluation test for major recruitment drives.
- e. Facilitating administrative requirements for actual conduct of on-campus placement drives.
- f. Maintaining record of students eligible for placement, their resumes, contact details and other relevant information.
- g. Maintaining recruiter feedback and improvising on-campus placement strategies based on the inputs thus received.
- h. Managing, mentoring and monitoring the placement process and maintaining discipline throughout the placement process.
- i. Initiating disciplinary procedure against students who either do not comply with the prescribed rules for on-campus placement activities or indulge in misconduct during placement activities.

## Objectives of the Rules

The On- Campus Placement rules of the University are intended:

- a. To define the overall structure and modality of on-campus placement procedure.
- b. To optimize the number of students who secure jobs through on-campus placement activities.
- c. To build the capacity of students for professional career up to the expectation and satisfaction of prospective employers.

## Scope of the Rules

Only students of the pre-final and final year of B.A.,LL.B (Hons.) Five Year Integrated Course and outgoing students of LL.M One Year Degree Programme are eligible for on-campus placement.

# Eligibility Criteria

All Pre-Final and Final year students of B.A.,LL.B (Hons.) Five Year Integrated Course and outgoing students of LL.M One Year Degree Programme are eligible for on-campus placement, except students:

- a. who did not register for on- campus placement with the PFC,
- b. who have more than 2 backlog papers at the time when on-campus placement drive begins,
- c. who have less than required class attendance as prescribed by UGC and BCI from time to time,
- d. who have undergone less than 3 internships programmes,
- e. who have been found guilty of gross misconduct and indiscipline.

## Registration with Placement Facilitation Committee

- a. All final year students are required to register with the PFC in the prescribed format
- b. Category of companies/law firms in which one seeks employment must be mentioned in the application

## **Application Process**

- a. Information regarding law firms/companies visiting campus for placement drive will be sent to registered students through e-mail notifications.
- b. A deadline for submission of application by interested registered students will be duly notified. Students who fail to adhere to the stipul ated deadline would not be allowed to participate in the announced placement drive.
- c. Students will have to submit their updated resumes in the prescribed format along with the application; thereafter, the list of students will be published by the PFC. Only students enlisted by the PFC will be allowed to participate in the announced placement drive.
- d. No application will be entertained with regard to companies/law firms that have not been invited by the PFC for on-campus placement drive.
- e. Students should inform the PFC if they have applied at an individual capacity to a law firm/company that has subsequently been invited by the university for on-campus placement drive.
- f. It is compulsory for registered students to attend the pre-placement talk .

#### Placement Rules

- a. Students registered with the PFC can submit applications seeking to participate in recruitment drives announced by the university until they have been offered a placement through formal placement offer by a recruiting company/firm.
- b. Students shall be permitted to receive a maximum of one job offer and the same must submit the job offer acceptance letter to PFC and the recruiting company/firm within the stipulated time. Any student who is offered a job by a company/firm would be kept out of the ambit of consideration for further placement drives.
- c. The offer of placement (by the company) and its acceptance (by the student) shall be communicated through the office of the PFC only.
- d. If a student receives more than one offer in a session / day and if there is a delay in the announcement of results by some companies, the student is bound to accept the job offer of the company whose result has been declared on time.
- e. If the results are declared on the same session / day, the student may choose from the offers in hand and inform the PFC of his/her choice, within 24 hours of announcement of results.
- f. Job Offer announcement on the notice board will be considered as firm offer. Offers received from companies must be collected by concerned students as per timings in circular / notice. The responsibility of going through the offer letter and taking actions therein such as submission of documents lies entirely with the student. All offers (made by the companies) shall be through the PFC only. This office will not be in a position to resolve problems, if any, that may arise with respect to offers made directly to the student by the company.
- g. Students who are placed in one company/firm and waitlisted by other companies will be given five (5) working days to accept the offer on hand. The PFC in the meantime will inform the company, where the same is waitlisted, about their present offer. The company that has waitlisted the students is required to release the offer or delete the name from the waitlist within two days, so that the student can make a timely decision.
- h. Students are not permitted to approach any company/law firm on their own, all liaison activities are to be routed through the PFC.
- i. Students are required to submit a soft copy of resume to the placement committee before the commencement of on-campus placement drive. The format for the resume and the time-frame for submission of the same shall be duly communicated by the PFC.
- j. Students are advised to carry a hard copy of updated resume in the prescribed format during their personal interview (PI) with the recruiter
- k. All information provided in the resume must be correct.
- I. If a company/law firm is interested in screening more candidates, then the PFC may advise other students (registered with the PFC but not selected for the specific placement activity) to submit their application on the spot.

#### Note for Recruiters

All companies/firms conducting on-campus placement drive at National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam are requested to release the Offer Letters and hand over the same to the PFC within an hour after completion of the recruitment process. The students should inform the acceptance of offer within 24 hours (on the day following the release of offer).

The company shall be intimated of the offer acceptance within three days of release of offer.

## **Short Listing Process**

- a. The recruiter may short list students on the basis of information submitted by the students in the resume.
- b. If the process of short-listing devolves on the university, the same shall be based on criteria such as:
  - I. CGPA
  - II. Class Attendance
  - III. Conduct of the Student

### Procedure for Withdrawal from a Particular Placement Drive

A student can withdraw from the placement drive conducted by a particular company to which he/she had applied after the pre-placement talk by submitting a written application to the PFC in a timely manner.

# Code of Conduct during Campus Placement

- a. Students are required to observe discipline and conduct themselves responsibly.
- b. Students are required to report 30 minutes prior to the pre-placement talk or interview.
- c. Students are required to keep copies of documents/ certificates/ photographs and updated resume sequentially arranged in order (minimum 2 copies) during PI. Further, it is advisable that soft-copies of all relevant documents pertaining to curricular and extra-mural activities of the students reflected in the resume are kept ready at hand.
- d. Students are advised to bring institute I-card at the time of written tests and interviews.
- e. Students are advised not to approach the company/law firm personnel directly
- f. Students are advised to maintain cordial relationship with the recruiters. Any inappropriate behaviour of students will not be tolerated and will result in disciplinary action by the university.
- g. Students are required to maintain appropriate dress code during placement drives.

Note: Immediately after coming out of the interview room, students should write down the questions they were asked and submit the same to the Placement Facilitation Committee for documentation.

- The nearest highway that connects to the University is N.H. 37 (Goalpara-Saikhoa Ghat).




